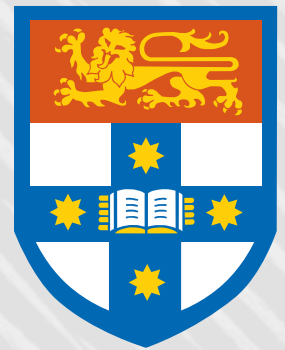

Chairman's Report

THIS WAS A CHALLENGING SEASON. IT BEGAN WITH THE LOSS OF NO FEWER THAN SEVEN PLAYERS WHO TOOK PART IN THE PREMIERSHIP-WINNING FIRST GRADE TEAM OF 2016-17.

Not one player was lost to another club, but Greg Mail, Ryan Carters, Will Hay, Kieran Elley and Ashton May all retired, while Dave Miller chose to travel and Tom Rogers seized with both hands the chance to excel in the first-class game with Tasmania. Few clubs could recover from the loss of so many exceptional players at the one time. Compounding that challenge was the loss of the Director of Cricket, Gary Whitaker, half way through the season.

I am happy to report that your club responded magnificently.

A very deliberate choice was made not to fill vacancies by recruiting, but instead to provide our existing players with the opportunity to step up and prove themselves in a higher grade. Most of them responded superbly. In what was virtually his first season in Firsts, Hayden Kerr was outstanding. Ben Trevor-Jones and Steve Hobson hit maiden First Grade hundreds; James Larkin narrowly missed one. Lawrence Neil-Smith did so well in his first season in Firsts that he earned a contract with Tasmania; Joe Kershaw won Futures League recognition; Damien Mortimer and Liam Robertson took on the responsibility of being senior players. This was perhaps the single most satisfying aspect of the season: the way in which so many players stepped up. Rebuilding from within a club is never easy, and so this was a most impressive achievement.

Several senior players also made invaluable contributions, especially Nick Larkin, with his leadership and torrent of runs, Ed Cowan, when available, and Tim Ley, brilliant with the new ball. Our one newcomer, Tim Cummins, was outstanding both behind the stumps and with the bat. The result was a memorable victory in the First Grade Limited Overs competition, and a defeat in the First Grade final. Parramatta was our opponent on each occasion, and we congratulate them on their exceptional season.

There's an inescapable disappointment when the last game of the season is the final, and you don't win it. But we should reflect on what a fine season this has been for Sydney University. Firsts won one competition and was runner-up

in another; Third Grade won its second premiership in three years; Seconds and Fourths reached the finals. This was a wonderful effort, and I'm grateful to the captains (James Larkin, Ash Cowan, AJ Grant and his deputies) for their tireless efforts in holding their teams together. Two abiding memories of the season will be Thirds' incredible escape act to beat Parramatta in the semi-final, and the physical battering Ash Cowan took from Sydney's young (very young) opening bowler on the first day of the Third Grade final, as he ensured that he remained at the crease at the end of play. Third Grade won its competition largely because the team refused to believe that they wouldn't.

The greatest concern for the club this season was the remarkable turnover of players. The club's basic expectation is that if you choose to play Premier Cricket, you will make yourself available throughout the entire season. But in 2017-18, we set new records for the number of players unavailable in some rounds. Injuries can't be helped, and nor can Saturday exams (which are becoming increasingly frequent), but it is unfair on the club and your fellow players to miss matches for reasons that are not compelling. Spending every Saturday in summer on a cricket field involves a level of commitment and sacrifice, but without that the club doesn't function as it should. This is an area the club will seek to address in the coming season.

The Club's Board and staff worked extremely hard this year and I'm grateful to them. Ben Joy combines several roles – Treasurer, opening bowler, striker of unorthodox sixes – with immense reliability. Adam Theobald, Hartley Anderson, Greg Mail and Mark Faraday continue to contribute irreplaceable wisdom and experience to the Club. Phil Logan resumed the thankless task of Chairman of Selectors this year, and carried out that role fairly and conscientiously. Dale Bryant juggled a thousand and one tasks with great diligence, perseverance and imagination, not least when it came to dealing with the perennial shortage of grounds.

Alex Blackwell was an important addition to our Board this season. While her appointment has the desirable effect of providing us with a more diverse Board, that is not the reason for her appointment. She was appointed because of her deep experience and knowledge of the game, because she understands what is required to perform consistently at elite levels of the game, and because she cares about the game and the people who play it. It was a pleasure to second her nomination to the Board of Cricket NSW at the end of the

season, and I have no doubt that she will perform exceptional service in that role.

Gary Whitaker joined Sydney University in 2010–11 and stepped down from his role this season. No club coach in recent times, perhaps ever, has created a more enviable record than Gary. Under his direction, we won the 2013–14 Club Championship, as well as four First Grade titles, a win in the First Grade Limited Overs competition, four Second Grade premierships, and premierships in Thirds, Fourths and Metropolitan Cup. Gary's efforts were recognized when he was named the SCA's Coach of the Year in 2013–14. He has continued to develop his skills by undertaking a Master's degree in coaching, and he has always approached his work with his own unique blend of insight and passion. We wish Gary and Robyn every success in their next endeavours. Following an exhaustive recruitment process, Cam Borgas has now been appointed as the new Director of Cricket. He brings a wealth of experience and a wide range of skills to the role, and we are fortunate to have him.

I must also acknowledge our supporters beyond the Club: our patient, generous sponsors; Rob Smithies and his staff at Sydney University Sport and Fitness, and the staff of Cricket NSW, especially the remarkably dedicated Roy Formica. Thanks to you all for making our season possible.

The club was shocked and saddened to learn of the sudden death of Patrick Rodgers, on Christmas Day 2017, in Cambodia. Patrick, who was only 23, never played for the club, but he was familiar to many of us as the young boy who had followed his father around the grade grounds of Sydney in the last years of James' long career with the club. It was heartening to see the spontaneous support offered by so many members of the club to James and Liz in the weeks following their loss of Patrick, and our thoughts and support remain with them. Times like these remind us that the club can mean so much more than a collection of cricketers running around a field on the weekend.

Having acted as Chairman for three years, I will not be seeking reappointment for a further term. I regret that a combination of work and family commitments will make it impossible for me to carry out the role as it ought to be carried out. I will, however, remain a close and active supporter of the finest cricket club in Australia, which it has been a privilege to serve.

Vice President (Finance) Report

PLEASE FIND ENCLOSED THE FINANCIAL REPORTS FOR SYDNEY UNIVERSITY CRICKET CLUB'S (SUCC) 2018 ANNUAL REPORT.

In the 12 months to 31 May 2018 the Club received revenue of \$356,087 (up from \$345,163 in 2016/17) and incurred expenses of \$354,658, leaving a surplus for the year of \$1,429.

The comparative result for 2016/17 was a surplus of \$1,314.

The club continues to be in a surplus position at the end of 2017/18 (currently \$26,894) and we continue to strive towards strengthening this position, whilst maintaining our investment in the growth of the cricket club and the coaching available to our members.

The University of Sydney continues to support student activities, especially the sporting clubs, and for this we wish to thank them. Without the Universities support we would not have had the success of recent years.

Further, we would like to thank all our sponsors and supporters who continue to contribute to the club. Without you all we would not be able to reach the high standards we set ourselves both on and off the field.

Congratulations to all members and supporters for another successful season as we look forward to an exciting new season.

General Manager's Report

Foundation Chairman Report

I OPEN THE FOUNDATION'S REPORT BY EXTENDING MY SINCERE THANKS TO ALL OUR MEMBERS, PARTICULARLY THOSE WHO GENEROUSLY MADE DONATIONS DURING THE 2017 FINANCIAL YEAR.

It is worth noting again this year that there are a number of long term infrastructure projects in the pipeline. We will in due course be seeking your support for these projects that will leave a lasting legacy at the Club. There is no better example than the donation made by Mr Barry Lambert towards the creation of the Martin-Lambert Indoor Nets. The nets form a part of the high performance sporting facility at the Sydney Uni Football Ground (previously No. 2 Oval) which includes this 3-lane indoor net facility; the Club's administration offices; a Boardroom; a two-floor high performance gymnasium; and a 300-person function room. In the coming seasons our focus will turn to upgrading the No. 1 Oval Scoreboard, upgrading St Paul's Oval, and securing our 3rd playing venue.

The importance of the Foundation is reflected in the success that the Club has found both on, and off, the field. The Foundation's financial assistance helps support the Director of Cricket role, as well as high performance specialist coaches such as Grant Lambert and Dr Rene Ferdinands. Our elite coaching structure provides our players with a cricket program that rivals many professional cricket organisations, and has led in 2017-18 to another highly successful season (1st grade runners up and Limited Overs Cup premiers, 3rd grade premiers). The Foundation also supports the development of talent identification programs such as our Winter Development Program and Green Shield Program. The Foundation supports various tours which, in 2017, included a pre-season tour to Brisbane, an intervarsity tour to Adelaide to take on Adelaide University, and the tour to Sri Lanka to contest the RedBull World Campus T20 Games in which the team reached the semi-finals. Finally, the Foundation's support allows us to provide essential equipment for coaching and grounds to ensure the best possible training and facilities for our players.

With your continuing support, we aim to take the Foundation forward again in 2018-19. We simply must do so to ensure the long-term viability of the Club and its programs.

Our goal is to build the Foundation funds to \$1m by 2020 and you will see a lot more on this campaign in 2018. This is critical in order to continue to provide financial stability for the Club as it strives to remain a leader in NSW Premier Cricket, arguably the strongest district competition in the world. There will also be specific infrastructure projects that will be announced over the coming year which we will seek support with. Finally, we will be seeking further pledges to cricketering scholarships such as The Mick O'Sullivan Scholarship which was announced at the Blue & Gold Luncheon in November 2016 and has been growing well.

Over the coming season, we will be providing opportunities for Foundation members and former players to re-engage with the Club. We are seeking to provide Foundation members and alumni with as many opportunities as possible to catch up with old friends, meet new ones, and engage with the Club that we all hold dear.

Club Captain's Report

ANOTHER YEAR AND ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL SEASON FOR SYDNEY UNIVERSITY CRICKET CLUB! IT SAYS SOMETHING ABOUT THE CALIBRE OF THE CLUB THAT WE CAN CLAIM A 3RD GRADE PREMIERSHIP, THE LIMITED OVERS CUP, HAVE THE TOP FOUR GRADES IN THE FINALS AND FIRST GRADE PLAYING YET ANOTHER GRAND FINAL AND STILL FINISH THE SEASON NOT FEELING TOTALLY SATISFIED. THE COMPETITIVENESS AND STRENGTH OF THE GRADES IS OUTSTANDING, BUT IT IS ALSO IMPORTANT TO TAKE A MOMENT TO REFLECT ON THE GREAT YEAR THAT WAS THE 2017/18 SEASON.

Firstly, a huge congratulations to the 3rd Grade side for their remarkable season. After a drought-breaking premiership for 3rd grade in the 2015/16 season, it has been an outstanding few seasons for the side led by Ash Cowan. A heartbreaking semi-final loss last season lit the fire for the year that has been. Whilst not dominating the competition throughout the regular season, they were comfortably into the finals, and with a healthy mix of experience and youth, it was a whole new game. The resilience and strength of this team was never clearer than in their semi-final against Parramatta. Starting the second day with only 60 runs to defend and 7 wickets to take, a lesser team would have folded. Instead, Woody produced a remarkable spell, and under the composed leadership of Ash and other senior players, they held their nerve to win by 6 runs. Another convincing display in the Grand Final the following week and we were celebrating our second Mitchell Cup in 3 years! As Ash has already written an extensive thesis on the season, I will refrain from too much more detail, but congratulations to all involved!

Our First Grade side also enjoyed a successful season, especially remarkable if you consider the number of players lost from last year's Premiership-winning side. It was a year of transition for the top team, losing Greg Mail, Ryan Carters, Tom Rogers and Ash May, with some apprehension at the beginning of the season as to how the team would cope with the change. However, with that came a sense of excitement for the players who would be getting an opportunity to prove themselves in

a strong side. A strong campaign and a thrilling Grand Final at Parramatta saw the side claim the Limited Overs Cup in emphatic fashion. First Grade Report

THE CHALLENGE FOR 2017/18 SEASON: BALANCING THE EXPECTATION OF BEING PREMIERS WITH THE REBUILDING OF A SIDE THAT HAD LOST MOUNTAINS OF EXPERIENCE. IT WAS THE FIRST SEASON FOR ALL BUT ONE OF THE CURRENT PLAYING GROUP (ED COWAN THE EXCEPTION) IN WHICH GREG MAIL WOULDN'T BE FORMING THE BACK BONE OF OUR PERFORMANCE. THE SAFETY NET WAS GONE, WE WERE SUDDENLY LIVING IN THE POST MAIL ERA.

A huge off season in the EAP by a number of individuals ensured that standards would not dip and the young chargers were well prepared. Hayden Kerr looked like the incredible hulk. Damien Mortimer appeared to have been training since mid-April. Joe Kershaw's body looked like it might hold together. The signs were good.

We were joined by a new face in Tim Cummins. A fantastic bloke and hugely experienced first grader, he was the perfect fit to replace Ryan Carters behind the stumps. Tim was thrust into the role of 'fines master' and can be proud of the fact he may have pioneered the cashless fines system revolution. Unsurprisingly, that was the least of his contributions.

Mortimer made his second XI debut for NSW whilst Kershaw made his debut for the Country NSW/ACT. Young Lawrence Neil-Smith led the wicket tally for NSW Metro in their successful campaign at the Under 19 National Championships.

It was a season of personal bests on the park:

- Robertson (719 runs & 24 wickets, 1 x hundred)
- Mortimer (1,115 runs @ 48.5, 2 x hundreds)
- Kerr (813 runs & 20 wickets)
- Larkin (1,097 runs @ 84.4, 5 x hundreds)
- Ley (59 wickets @ 17.3)
- Trevor-Jones (587 runs, 1 x hundred)
- Tim Cummins (577 runs, 1 x hundred & 49 dismissals)

Cricket requires individual performances within a team setting. That is what we got from this group, and it was a pretty decent formula for success.

The bowling effort was led by Tim Ley, as reflected by an equal

career high haul of 59 wickets. He was incredibly consistent in his wicket taking, but more than that, he led the attitude on flat wickets and ran in hard in situations where bowlers from other sides would have given up. Tim is the ultimate competitor and he has shown this year in and year out for the club.

Joe Kershaw had his season end abruptly through injury, but was one of the stand out bowlers across Sydney in the first half of the season. It is exciting to think what Joe is capable of achieving when his body matures.

Hayden Kerr transformed our limited overs team by taking the game on at the top of the order in a manner we haven't seen since Ian Moran was in his pomp. He was fearless in his approach, hitting the best bowlers in Sydney over their heads from the first ball of the innings. Not only that, his skillful and slippery left arm pace has the potential to make him one of Sydney's most dangerous players. Watch this space.

Liam Robertson, who captained the side for half the season, put together the sort of season he has been threatening to have for 5 years. His clean hitting and level head in the middle order was a point of difference in many games. In fact, his 19 sixes throughout the season tied the record in a first grade season for the club. Combine that with his underused medium pace bowling and you can quickly see why he once represented Zimbabwe at under 14 level.

Ben Trevor-Jones had a breakout season in first grade. His ability to bat time at the top of the order got us through many tough first sessions. As an opener, you don't always get the scoreboard reward for hard work, but Ben toiled harder than most and made good contributions all season. His maiden first grade century was a special day, as he pounded Blacktown to all parts of number 1 oval.

Damien Mortimer went from strength to strength. His attention to detail in preparation sets the tone for the young players at the club. Following up his stunning debut season in 2016/17, Morts was quickly into his work again. His consistency was the cornerstone of our batting performances, but more importantly he stood up in big games. He dominated the limited overs final series and made a match winning century against Sydney in the Belvedere Cup semi-final. More of the same will see Damien move smoothly into first class cricket when the opportunity presents.

A deserved victory in the Limited Overs competition was highlighted by a stunning Tim Cummins century in the Grand Final against Parramatta. What a time to make a maiden first grade hundred. Never has there been a more deserving recipient of the Michael Bevan Medal, but beyond that, his reliability in the middle order ensured we fought our way out of trouble.

The huge heart and incredible toughness of Ben Joy was on display in the Grand Final. He bowled a 10 over spell as his feet bled, then had his arm badly broken whilst batting. Despite clearly being in agony he refused to leave the field and batted on in a losing cause. When the players viewed his x-ray the next morning it was hard not to feel equal parts physically ill and proud of his effort.

Our youngest team members, Devlin Malone and Lawrence Neil-Smith both showed that they have what it takes to lead the attack in the years to come [Ed – congratulations to LNS who has earned a Rookie contract with Cricket Tas]. Devlin, despite not reaching his own high standards, yielded 36 wickets for the season. Most spinners would be very happy with that. A big off season will see Dev back as a dominant force. Lawrence bowled with maturity beyond his years in the Grand Final to take 4/49 in a losing cause. His belief in his own ability and cool head will hold him in good stead to make a name for himself. Arguably our best bowler in both the Grand Finals, he is already a big game player.

Ed Cowan called stumps on his professional career. A poster boy for Sydney University Cricket Club if there ever was one, Ed has captured the imagination of the club and his teammates as he scaled the heights of the game over the years. We were lucky to have Ed's services regularly this season, seeing some dominant batting performances and some impactful spells of leg spin bowling. The fact he cares deeply for his club and the people within it inspires current players and counts for more than his stacks of runs ever could.

It is a reflection of the high standards our club has set that we claimed the Limited Overs title and were runners up in the Belvedere Cup, yet still felt a tinge of disappointment.

In a challenging year off the field for the club, the maturity of the young players in taking accountability for their own preparation was key to our success. The way they looked after one another and addressed their individual skill sets is a credit to them – something that will hold them in good stead for the lives on and off the field in the future. The side also enjoyed

each other's company and toasted the success of individuals who had a day out, knowing that not every weekend can be yours. This was an incredibly tough but highly enjoyable and rewarding season.

Beyond the boundary, many thanks must go to the board for handling some unforeseeable scenarios that confronted the club during the season. Again, the support of a group that care deeply for the club makes Saturday's feel much easier than they otherwise could.

As always, many thanks to our tireless scorer John Kilford. No one deserved a victory over the Easter weekend more than 'JK'. The time he gives to us is one of the most crucial contributions that could be made. He's a great a scorer who takes pride in his work and very good company as well – a pretty rare combination I think. His new found passion for cricket photography also provided some superb visuals of the many moments that constitute a cricket season.

Again, it was an absolute privilege to lead this group and I know that whatever the off season throws at us, we will adapt and we will come out as contenders when September rolls around.

Unfortunately for the team Lawrence Neil-Smith was quickly snavelled up by first grade, but played no small part in achieving a finals berth for the team. Jono Craig-Dobson had another good season, bowling consistently and building pressure from an end, while Dugald Holloway found a new level of pace and accuracy which will hold him in good stead for the seasons to come in first grade.

Ultimately it was a season with contributions from so many players and a season that will take us forward as a club towards further success. We are blessed to have a group of players at our club that are talented, hardworking and above all good people to play cricket and share successes / failures with. It was a pleasure to captain the side for the first time and I'm certain that team and individual success is only around the corner for this group.

Fifth Grade Report

CLOSE, AND CHALLENGING GAMES DEFINED THE EARLY PART OF THE SEASON FOR THE 5TH GRADE UNITS AS THEY BATTLED HARD AGAINST THEIR OPPOSITION. LOSING BACK TO BACK ROUNDS SO EARLY IN THE SEASON, AGAINST BLACKTOWN (1 WICKET) AND WESTERN SUBURBS (2 RUNS), WAS ALWAYS GOING TO BE A TOUGH MENTAL HURDLE TO OVERCOME. HOWEVER, ANY SEASON WITH A TALENTED TEAM WILL YIELD HIGHLIGHTS THAT SHOULD BE CONGRATULATED, AND VICTORIES FOR SUCH A TEAM ARE ALWAYS WAITING AROUND THE CORNER.

A win against Blacktown was ours for the taking after a strong opening stand of 62 between Hugh Farrow and Hayden Storey led to a usually defendable 233 at St. Pauls. Shehan Canagasingham also performed well in loss with figures of 5/28 from 9.4 overs including 4 maidens. Alex Bell was the standout batsman against Wests as he ground out his 50 across 2 days, and drastically different conditions to set up our 152-run chase. Ultimately, we fell short unable to stem the flow of wickets after the top order fell late on Day 1.

A Round 5 drubbing at the hands of Penrith forcibly kicked our season into gear as we were determined to rebound off the bottom of the table. Sydney were the first on our roll of victories. Islam posted a quickfire 50 and Shiv Pathak spun a web to take 5/17 from his 10 overs. Sydney never really looked in the contest, struggling to contain runs or build a partnership. Singing the song for the first time stirred the team to keep improving. A comfortable victory against Northern District followed. Liam McElduff and Farrow combined for a 106-run opening partnership that was reinforced by some late hitting from Robbie Browne (64 runs, 10 boundaries and 1 six). A spectacular outfield catch/faceplant by Browne and a medium pace short ball barrage from McElduff were also features in an entertaining match. No fewer than 45 players took the field throughout the year, making continuity and team building virtually impossible. Not one single player from our round one team was in our final round line up.

With a reasonable turnover of players in the off season, we took a core group of young players into the season and it was a steep learning curve for many.

Focusing on the positives, we had some outstanding individual performances and discovered some potential higher grade players for the future. This is very encouraging and shows once again that there is a definite purpose for a Metropolitan Cup team.

This season's breakout player was Ashwin Kirubanandan who, after some strong performances for the Lions team in his first few games for the club, broke into the Metro side in Round 4. Some season highlights include:

Tom Draca's match winning 7/32 off 6.5 overs vs Warringah when we were defending 98 was one of the most ferocious spells of fast bowling I can recall in a lower grade match. The new batsmen were genuinely scared to face our young tearaway. Tom's a greatly talented and enthusiastic young man who I hope finds time for cricket next year as he navigates his HSC.

A 60-run last wicket stand between Greg Cade and Om Prakash Sah in the above match vs Warringah gave our bowlers just the right amount of runs to bowl to (98 played 95).

Despite the various line-up changes each week, we managed to keep the team spirit high, particularly in the field. We did have our struggles at times with the bat this season but due to our bowling attack and excellent standards in the field we were able to dig ourselves out of some precarious situations.

Usually a Metro captain will lament the dropped catches that cost matches however, our catching and ground fielding was very good this season. There were many games at our home ground of St Pauls that due to construction in the surrounding areas we would have to defend a 45 metre boundary on one side of the field. Everybody assigned to those positions were willing to put their bodies on the line to protect easy boundaries from being hit.

Overall I'm proud of the way we conducted ourselves this season as a club and a team, playing hard fighting till the end in many close games and in the right spirit of cricket.

Awards and Trophies 2017–2018 Season

Captain John Morris Memorial Award

- For the Most Valuable Clubperson

Edward Arnott and Lewis McMahon

Named in honour of Captain John 'Skipper' Morris, President of the Club 1956–62, patron from 1962 until his death in 1975, scorer for 1st Grade and Poidevin-Gray, and an inspiration behind the Club for many years, this trophy is awarded to the Club member who has made the most valuable and selfless contribution to the Club.

John Lambie Award

- For Outstanding Captaincy

Ashley Cowan

John Lambie played for the Club in the lower grades from 1950–58. He took over 200 wickets, including 46 in one season, and was a well-respected 4th Grade captain. John was a selfless team man who could have easily played in higher grades during his career.

Tom Garrett Award

- For Best and Fairest

Alasdair Grant

Tom Garrett played for University from 1873 until 1898, representing Australia in the first ever Test in 1877. He was a medium pacer, an inspirational club captain and a dominant batsman.

I E Fisher Award

- For the Most Valuable First Grade Player

Hayden Kerr

Ian Fisher, 1st Grade captain from 1969 to 1978, enjoyed an outstanding career with University and was the Club's highest 1st Grade run scorer for almost three decades. He was widely regarded as one of the most entertaining batsman at the club.

Most Valuable Twenty20 Player

Damien Mortimer

With the growing success of the T20 format, this award was presented for the first time in 2015–16.

Brian Hickey Award

- For Most Valuable Poidevin-Gray Player

Nicky Craze

Brian Hickey has been a Vice-President of the Club since 1986 and a long standing supporter. He has donated this award for the most valuable Poidevin-Gray player of each season.

Alan Crompton Award

- For Most Valuable Green Shield Player

Jazz Rinka

1997–98 was the Club's first season in the A.W. Green Shield competition. The award is named after Alan Crompton whose continual service to the Club since 1961 has been inspirational.

Dr Jim L'Estrange Award

- For Most Valuable Undergraduate Player

Hayden Kerr

Dr Jim L'Estrange played for the Club in the 1930s and 40s and was a Vice-President from 1978 until his death in 1990. Two of his sons, Michael and Jim, played First Grade for University. He wished this award to be used to encourage undergraduates.

Scholarship Award

Jonathon Craig-Dobson

The Scholarship Award was first presented in 2009–10 and is awarded each year to a scholarship holder who has made the most consistent off-field contributions to the Club during the season.

Eric McElhone Memorial Award

- For 1st Grade Fielding

Tim Cummins

Eric McElhone played First Grade for University from 1905 to 1913, scoring 2053 runs and representing NSW. He was an outstanding agile fieldsman. He first donated this award in 1955 and it was perpetuated by his family after his death in 1981.

Daniel Ward Award

- For Lower Grades Fielding

Tom Galvin

First named in 2014–15 as an acknowledgment of Daniel Ward's services to the Club as a wicket keeper and captain. Daniel kept wickets in 1st Grade but also captained the 2nd Grade sides to considerable success culminating in the 2008–09 Premiership. Renowned particularly for his encouragement and inspiration for the younger players in his teams.

Ray Eastcott Award

- For Best All-rounder

Hayden Kerr

Ray Eastcott was a valuable and practical supporter of the Club in the 1980s, when his son Andrew played for the Club. The Eastcott family has presented this award, in his memory, to the Club's best all-rounder each season.

J M Taylor Award

- For Batting Average

Nick Larkin

Johnny Taylor was the young Don Bradman's hero. At the age of 12, Bradman saw his first Test match and Taylor "impressed me as being the kind of player I would like to emulate." Taylor played 20 Tests for Australia and in four seasons, while studying Dentistry at the University, scored 2231 runs in First Grade at an average of 60.29.

H O Rock Award

- For Batting Aggregate

Damien Mortimer

Dr H O (Juja) Rock played First Grade for the Club from 1919 until 1926 after returning badly injured from WW1. He scored 3899 runs in First Grade at 44.31 and, in six First Class matches, 758 at an outstanding average of 94.75 with a top score of 235. In the Sheffield Shield, his average was 112, one of the few records set in that competition that Bradman failed to beat.

James Rodgers Award

- For Bowling Average

Shehan Canagasingham

James Rodgers played for the Club from 1972 until 2010, taking a record 865 wickets. He was a most successful lower grades captain and a loyal supporter of the Club, including a stint as Chairman from 2013 to 2015.

Michael O'Sullivan Award

- For Bowling Aggregate

Tim Ley

Mick O'Sullivan played for the Club from 1968 to 1995 and is the leading First Grade wicket-taker with 622 wickets at 21.07 and 807 wickets in all grades. Micko was Chairman of the Club from 2005 until his death in 2013.

PRIOR TO THE SEASON SYDNEY UNI 'VETS' CHANGED OUR NAME TO SYDNEY UNI LIONS AND DECIDED TO INTEGRATE OURSELVES MORE CLOSELY WITH THE SUCC.

This was a response to a decline over recent seasons in the playing numbers. It meant that some of our sides during the season had a healthy smattering of younger SUCC guys on the park. However, there were still some weekends when we struggled for numbers, and we forfeited twice. Nonetheless, I believe this is a step in the right direction, so the plan for the coming season is to further strengthen the affiliation with SUCC.

In terms of overall results, we won 7 of the 15 games we played during season 2017/18, including winning 5 out of the 8 games we played after Xmas (and winning our T20 fixture).

The season started with the new look Lions comfortably accounting for Cranbrook Old Boys, who were kept to 7-99 from their 35 overs, with 3 wickets to Ashwin Kirubanandan, and 2 to each of Prasan Adikirage and Will Samurai. Lions chased that down with plenty of overs to spare, thanks largely to Rakin Rahman (46). Next game saw a narrow loss to Reg Bartley XI in our first Jack Pace game, with Lions chasing 192 for victory and falling only 5 runs short. Highlight was 72 from Mo Ghumman, to go with his 4 wickets earlier in the afternoon.

From there we went suffered a few batting collapses. Although in one of those losses, 15 yo Sydney Uni green shield leg spinner Luce Demeglio took 6-26. Against Scots OB in early November, in our 3rd Jack Pace game, we chased down 203 on the Scots main oval - our best batting performance of the season, largely due to Matt Skinner (95*), and Mo Ghumman (83*); their partnership was worth 154 unbeaten. Although we were 3/77 at drinks, and needing over 7 per over, after drinks Matt and Mo made easy work of it, and we won with a couple of overs to spare.

After that the rest of November and all of December was a lean period. We won a game on forfeit, lost another on forfeit, had a washout, and lost a few.

Things turned after the Xmas break, starting with a good win over Paddington at St Andrews in almost 40C heat, including Angus Stevens scoring 62 before collapsing and falling asleep,

and then Mo Ghumman taking the side's second 6 fa for the season (6-11). As mentioned above, we ended up winning 5 of the 8 games played after Xmas, including a close victory against Rangers on a damp wicket at Jubilee Park. In that game our friends the Apaches provided about half of the side, and Andrew Wilkinson top-scored (30) before Smokey and fellow Apache Gazi Hossein saw us home 8 wickets down. Later in March we also won another close chase, passing Beavers total of 130 with 9 wickets down, with Ryan Bulger getting us home (36*), after SJ de Silva had top-scored (39). We finished the season with a strong win against Hunters Hill, after batting first and scoring 7/204. In the midst of all that we also had an enjoyable T20 against a Souths Rangers shires side under the 'lights' at Alan Davidson oval - our score of 172 (Alex Mihalyka -50 odd in a cameo appearance) was far too many for Souths Rangers batting second under the poor lighting.

Unfortunately a mix up with the team scorebook means that I do not have complete records for the season. On the batting side Mo Ghumman was clearly the team's leading runscore, and Angus Stevens had a good season when he was available to open. There were also some useful contributions with the bat from a couple of the SUCC guys who played. Bowling was probably our weaker link, with Phil Bowman or Mo Ghumman the likely candidates for leading wicket taker. Although we did witness 4 separate 'Michelles' during the season, as per the stats below.

Thanks to everyone who played with the Lions this season gone. Special mention to Pieter Mees, who has kept wickets, and also kept spirits up, for the Vets for perhaps the last 8 years, but now departs to live in the UK. An excellent keeper and a lovely bloke to play with, our loss is Cambridge's gain. Pieter, your calls of '3 and 4 now lads' will be missed. Also special mentions to Tim Croft, Pieter, Greg Cade and Ryan Bulger for skippering during the season.

Special thanks to Dale Bryant, Andrew Wilkinson, Greg Cade and anyone else from SUCC who helped us with players during the season past. Also 'Smokey' Yap, who regularly arranged Apaches players to help fill the side on our Sunday games.

Obituaries

Keith Hubert Sheffield, 1930–2017

From a young age Keith Sheffield was a popular boy with a pleasant manner and showed an early talent on the sporting field. This combination matured into what the '56–'57 Sydney University Cricket side would call an interesting temperament for the Sydney District competition of those post World War days. The teams were still playing their first class members between Sheffield Shield contests and Tests. Many Clubs had older captains of considerable ability, consider Jack Chegwyn and Ken Gulliver. Respect and manners were du jour. We needed a worthy skipper to keep them honest. He did.

Keith attended Canterbury Boys High School where he played both cricket and rugby league. Against Parramatta High he played against Ritchie Benaud. Cricket was his first love but he also excelled in football and golf. Although he never mentioned it to his children, his wife, Barbara, always said he was an excellent tennis player as well. A prefect and vice-captain at his high school he excelled academically as well as on the sports field. He was interested in the classical languages of Greek and Latin and taught himself Greek while still at high school.

At University he began cricket in the lower grades but was too talented not to rise to the top. He was a higher-order batsman and complete all round fieldsman. He was listed in the Sydney University Cricket Blue awards for 1953. A Blue is earned by students who study at University and achieve unique standards set by the University when competing at the highest level in Inter-university and national competitions. At Sydney University he met Barbara. He studied Law, Latin, French, Philosophy and History and graduated in Arts/Law in 1952. He became a solicitor working in Sydney CBD, where according to someone who knew him at the time he was popular and highly regarded for his work.

Following graduation he was not eligible to continue with the Sydney University Cricket Club and during this time SUCC had disappointing results even though there was a nucleus of first graders with potential. The feeling grew that he would be an appropriate leader to foster that potential as well as being an asset to the team as a player. And as a graduate he would become eligible again if appointed captain. He had a good knowledge of the game, and importantly, of players in the various clubs. Under his leadership the team developed a new hopefulness and began to have success. Saxon White commented years later 'The only thing that made 56–57 different however, was that the University side grew up together over a few years.....so in that season when Keith Sheffield took the captaincy, the District Clubs were faced with a more confident and growly University..... Keith managed one of the best cricket years of our lives.'

A key example of his initiative was to risk Donald Scott-Orr (for lack of another) as the team's slow, off-spin bowler. Donald was predominantly an opening batsman and had not bowled slow stuff during earlier years with the club. To universal surprise this bore fruit, being backed by a talented fielding side. In addition, he had two good quick opening bowlers in Frank Stening and David Walker, and superb stock medium pacers in Amos and Woodfield, yet he understood the wisdom of using his slow bowler unexpectedly early in the innings for reasons of surprise and because the main weapon of this bowler was what he did in the air, with the relatively new ball, rather than off the pitch. Confidence grew. The team engaged the semi-finals for the first time in many years. It proved a renaissance.

With much time devoted to sport Keith was not able to keep up fully with his work as a solicitor, and with financial demands of a growing family (by now 4 children) he made the decision in 1964 to leave legal practice, and Sydney, and take the family to Cooma, where he took on a job with the Snowy Mountains Authority. He wasted no time in joining Cooma Golf Club and Cooma Cricket Club. Next, he took a job at the University of New England in Armidale, where he worked under Zelman Cowen (later Sir Zelman Cowen, Governor-General of Australia), and of course joined the local golf club. In the early 1970s the family relocated to Brisbane when Zelman Cowen, who had become Vice-Chancellor at the University of Queensland, offered him a job as Assistant Registrar. He worked there until his retirement in 1990. He had joined the local golf club and a steady stream of club prizes came into the house as he won weekend rounds and competitions. While there he also won awards for two Study Tours to the United States and Europe.

It was after he lost Barbara his memory began to fail. However, in the 150 years Celebration of Sydney University Cricket Club, his daughter Jan flew him from Brisbane to attend in a wheel-chair, and he sat with his 1956–57 team.

Sir Eric McClintock

Sir Eric McClintock died peacefully on 27 March 2017 aged 99. He played for the Club in 1938–39.

After graduating from the University of Sydney, Sir McClintock entered into a successful career in public service, eventually receiving a knighthood for his services to export and industry in 1981. Upon leaving the public sector, Sir McClintock became Chairman of Woolworths Ltd from 1980 to 1987, in which time the "Fresh Food People" slogan was instituted.

Gerry Gleeson

Gerry Gleeson, who died at Concord on 23 December 2017, was for twelve years (from 1977 to 1988) the head of the New South Wales Premier's Department, a position which made him the senior, and by far the most influential, bureaucrat in the State.

Gleeson was born on June 12, 1928, the third child and only son of a primary school teacher, Thomas Gleeson, and his wife Gladys. The family, of Irish descent, devoutly Catholic and strongly pro-Labor, lived in Five Dock in Sydney's inner west. Gerald attended St Patrick's College, Strathfield. In 1944, at the age of 15, he took a Teachers' College scholarship to do a science degree at Sydney University. He played in the lower grades for the University Cricket Club, and played Rugby for Drummoyne. The club's records for this period are scant, but the Annual Report for 1944-45 shows that he played Third Grade and identifies him as a "young player who will do well". The few surviving reports of his matches show that he took 2-9 against Balmain, played against a St George side that included the young Les Favell, and appeared at least once in Second Grade.

In 1948, Gleeson became a teacher with the state education system. In 1951, he married a secretary, Frances Carlon, and in that year they moved to Victoria where Gerald studied for a bachelor of education degree at Melbourne University and taught at the Royal Australian Navy College in Flinders. In 1953, Gleeson took up a job with the NSW Department of Technical Education. In 1958, he became head teacher in chemistry in the department's school of general studies. He also became involved with the NSW Teachers Federation and was elected to the federation's state council. He began to develop strong connections within the right wing of the Labor Party.

After becoming an education inspector with the NSW Public Service Board, he completed a Master's degree in education at Sydney University and, in 1968, was promoted to chief inspector. He may have continued his career in the education sector but for the election of Neville Wran as Premier of New South Wales. After Wran appointed him head of the Premier's Department, Gleeson's authority extended across all ministerial portfolios, and many regarded him as the most powerful man in the State after the Premier.

Following his retirement from the public service in 1988, he acted as national president of the Royal Institute of Public Administration and trustee of both the Powerhouse Museum and the NSW Art Gallery. He was a member of the finance committee of the Sydney Opera House and served as chairman of the Sydney Entertainment Centre Company. He was also appointed to the Commonwealth Remuneration Tribunal. He became a director of the Commonwealth Bank of Australia and Amalgamated Holdings Ltd and the St George Foundation, council member of the Australian Catholic University, and chairman of the Darling Harbour Authority, the Sydney Harbour Foreshore Authority, the National Catholic Education Commission, the Transfield Construction Management Committee and the Lord Howe Island Board. He closely involved in the formation of Australian Catholic University.

The Club extends its condolences to Mr Gleeson's family, including his sons Fabian (a judge of the New South Wales Court of Appeal), Justin (the former Commonwealth Solicitor General, who played briefly for the club in the 1970s), Gerald and Damian and his daughter Catherine.

Phil Blazey

Phil Blazey died on 21 August 2017, at the age of 75.

A product of Barker College, where he played in the Firsts at both cricket and Rugby, Phil matriculated to Sydney University where he studied Chemical Engineering. He played in the lower grades for the club, and excelled at baseball, winning a Blue in 1963 and representing New South Wales. Phil's older brothers, Doug and John, were already playing cricket for Sydney University when Phil arrived at the club in 1960. In his three seasons for University, Phil scored 999 runs at 19.98 and took 26 wickets at 19.19, playing Seconds, Thirds and Poidevin-Gray. His 454 runs at 32.42 in Thirds in 1961-62 included an innings of 120 against Mosman and he made some useful contributions to the 1962-63 premiership-winning side in Second Grade.

After graduating, he took a job with Commonwealth Industrial Gases which took him to Perth; there he played cricket for North Perth, and represented Western Australia in baseball.

Returning to Sydney, Blazey married his wife, Mary, in November 1966, but not until he had played Second Grade for Northern District earlier in the same afternoon. Phil and Mary lived for a time in England, where Phil played club cricket for Hampstead. He returned to play for Northern District, and he represented that club until 1987, playing in Seconds and Thirds, often as captain. His off breaks seldom turned sharply, but they were cunningly varied and naggingly accurate. He scored 2655 runs for the club, as well as taking 373 wickets. When the young Mark Taylor first arrived at the Northern District club, Phil Blazey was his first captain. He gave loyal, enthusiastic and tireless service to the Waitara club for almost fifty years.

The club extends its condolences to Phil's family, especially his wife, Mary and their children, Anna, Roger and Eleanor.

Dr David Howell

Dr David Howell died 5 July 2017, aged 89.

Dr Howell received Sydney University Cricket Club 1st Grade cap no. 339 in 1944 and by the end of his career at Sydney Uni in 1948 had hit 516 runs at an average of 14.7 from 38 innings with a highest score of 55 not out.

Claiming a Cricket Blue in 1944-45, acting as Honorary Secretary for the 1945-46 season, and being a Life Member of the Cricket Foundation, Dr Howell made a significant contribution in his time at the Club.

Anthony Edgar

Tony Edgar was a tall leg spinner who came to the Club from Sydney Grammar School.

At the University he studied law and spent his working life in the city with law firms. He was a highly competent and well regarded practitioner, dispensing practical advice.

He and his Canadian wife Sylvia, whom Tony met at a Cricket Society function for a visiting English team in the early 1960s raised his family of a son, Gordon and two daughters , Jane and Liz. He maintained interest in Test Cricket, Rugby and Tennis as well as golf.

He was actively involved in a number of charitable activities.

For the Club he played first grade and quite a lot in the seconds.

There was competition from a number of other spinners in that era, from the likes of Donald Scott-Orr, David Fox, Roger Mulready, and John Blazey.

Tony played firsts initially in 1956–57 (1st Grade cap 414), and his final season in 1st Grade was in 1961–62. He possessed a good wrong-un and used his height. In 1st Grade he took 30 wickets at an average of 30.4 and scored 60 runs at an average of 6.7.

After leaving SUCC Tony played 21 seasons with I. Zingari in City and Suburban where he took 385 wickets at just over 19 apiece, averaging a wicket every three and a half overs. He also played many times in the then renowned Sydney University 3rd XI Veterans XI and a Muswellbrook Gentleman's XI.

He was a Member of the SUCC Foundation.

Club Records: 1854–93

FOR SEVERAL YEARS, THE CLUB'S ANNUAL REPORT HAS CARRIED THE CLUB'S RECORDS SINCE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE GRADE COMPETITION IN 1893-94. THE CLUB WAS, HOWEVER, ESTABLISHED IN 1864 AND FOR THIRTY YEARS BEFORE THE GRADE COMPETITION WAS FORMED, IT COMPETED AS ONE OF THE LEADING CLUBS IN SYDNEY.

The following records are taken from all available published sources, including newspapers, club annual reports and sporting periodicals. For some seasons, full details exist for all the club's First Eleven matches: in other seasons, the records are incomplete. For example, in 1873–74 the club played 11 matches, but details have survived of only nine; in 1874–75, 13 games were played, of which only eleven were reported. It is doubtful that these figures can be improved unless some unpublished source (such as scorebooks) is discovered.

In the early years of Sydney cricket it was common for scores to be published without full bowling analyses. Where it is known from a published score that a bowler took wickets, but the full analysis is not available, those wickets are identified by the + symbol. For example, Tom Garrett's figures are 622 (545+77) wickets for 5891 runs, average 10.81.

This means that, in games for which the full analysis is known, he took 545 wickets for 5891 runs at an average of 10.81, but he also took 77 wickets for which no analysis is available.

As early as 1866, the University club fielded Second and Third Elevens. The scores of these matches were published so erratically and infrequently that it is not possible to compile meaningful records from them. All records listed below refer to matches played by the University 1st Eleven.

Challenge Cup

Between 1870 and 1878, the "senior" clubs in Sydney (Albert, Warwick, University, East Sydney and Newtown) competed for a Challenge Cup. University held the Challenge Cup in 1871–72 after defeating the holder, Warwick, by an innings and 98 runs. Albert won the Cup from University later in the same season.

Holdsworth-Gardyne Cup

The Holdsworth-Gardyne Cup was donated for competition between the senior Sydney cricket clubs in 1881–82. Sydney University won the Cup in 1882–83 and 1883–84. After successfully defending the Cup on three occasions, Sydney University became, under the competition rules, the permanent holder of the Cup.
